MESSAGE FROM THE VICAR OF THE CATHEDRAL

My dear Friends in Christ,

Greetings to you in the name of Jesus Christ our Saviour!

Church: The Church watches with deep concern the breakdown that continues to adversely impact the life of our nation and its people. The peaceful protests that are taking place across the country cannot be ignored as they are reflective of the thinking of the population. The Church too has added its voice to the cries of the people.

The joint prayer campaign together with the Roman Catholic Church and a few other Mission partners that took place on the eve of Palm Sunday was indicative of this sentiment. It was also a powerful sign of our collective Christian Witness.

Drawing from the example of the acts of the apostles whose witness we reflect on this season of Easter, may we continue to find direction ourselves as the people of God for all that we are called to engage in as the people of God.

Nation: As the peaceful people's protests continue to take place, it is now becoming evident that much of what was being perceived to have taken place is true. Corrupt leaders must be held accountable for their corrupt actions and decisions that have seriously compromised the safety and wellbeing of the entire nation and its people. Further, it is even more disappointing to note that while many have suffered seriously because of short sighted and poor decisions, a few people have benefited immensely by supporting the establishment to engage blatantly in their corrupt practices. The resources that have been plundered from the nation need to be returned for a process of healing and meaningful accountability to begin.

Visitor to the Cathedral: I am happy to inform you that the newly appointed Dean of the Bradford Cathedral Rev. Canon Andrew Bowerman has accepted my invitation to be our Guest Preacher on Sunday 15th May 2022. At present he serves as the Regional Head of the Mission to Seafarers (Mts), Middle East and South Asia. He will be visiting the Mts Centre in Colombo between 11th – 16th May 2022.

Bible Study: I was disappointed but compelled to cancel the last in the series of Bible Studies on 1 Peter due to circumstances beyond my control. I trust that those of you who attended the Bible study found it helpful and encouraging. I am also happy to let you know that I was able to engage with Rev. Jenn Strawbridge in person when I met her in Amman, Jordan recently and share that her material was used for the Bible study. She was encouraged and inspired to learn that we had used the content of this material that she has compiled for the Lambeth Conference, scheduled to take place later this year.

Confirmation Classes: It appears that the announcement that appeared in the April newsletter for confirmation classes has gone un-noticed. The last date for enrolment will now be revised to 15th May 2022.

50th Anniversary of the Cathedral: The first meeting of this committee will take place on Wednesday 11th May 2022 at 6pm. The Cathedral office will get in touch with the Steering Committee that is being proposed to give direction to this task and this same committee will co-opt others into the core group as required.

Statement by the Church of Ceylon on the Rambukkana incidents

We are deeply saddened and concerned by the deaths and injury to many as a result of the incidents in Rambukkana on 19^{th} April.

We wish to reiterate the importance of restraint and discernment in the use of force by officers of the State in response to civilian protests and demonstrations. The unrest that is experienced in several parts of the country is the result of agitation driven by the anger and frustration of desperate citizens. The people are appealing for relief in order to restore their livelihoods and make ends meet. These protests have to be viewed in the wider context of the country being now declared bankrupt and the serious crises of accountability and governance that the country has experienced in recent years.

We call upon the President and the government to heed the call of the people of this country by allowing an alternate government to take charge of the affairs of this country. While we welcome the admission by the President that wrong policies adopted by his administration have contributed to the current crisis, mere admissions of mistakes will not put things right. The present government has clearly lost its mandate to govern in the eyes of the people. To ignore and seek to suppress such an unprecedented public outcry and be blind to reality will be another serious folly. A government which has undermined independent institutions and concentrated power in a single institution and mismanaged the economy driving the country to bankruptcy, does not have a moral right to navigate the country out of such a crisis by relying on a mandate achieved in the past. Its desperate measures to cling to power by appointing people to positions of power with perks and powers of patronage will only increase the anger of the people. We wish to remind the President and the current government that the voice of the people from all corners of the country and from all walks of

life clearly demonstrates that they have lost faith in the ability of this administration to face the challenges ahead.

We also call upon the Inspector General of Police, the Heads of the Armed Forces and all members of the services that are under their leadership to respect the Constitution and the Rule of Law and the basic human rights of the people including the freedoms of speech, expression, the right to dissent and peaceful assembly. The current political and economic crisis must be resolved through dialogue and negotiation, not by violence and ignoring or suppressing the voice of the people.
