## MESSAGE FROM THE VICAR OF THE CATHEDRAL

My dear Friends in Christ,

Greetings to you in the name of Jesus Christ our Saviour!

**Church:** The people of God need to be united in prayer as the nation continues to struggle with the multiple crises it faces. In the midst of these realities, our Diocese together with the Diocese of Kurunegela, the Methodist Church of Sri Lanka and the National Christian Council has commenced a series of events that will recognize the sacrificial contribution made by the "*Malaiyaga Makkal*" people of the plantation community to our country and its economy.

Even though the tea industry is one pillar that sustains the economy of our country, the people who toil towards making that a reality live in conditions that are far from satisfactory.

Successive governments have exploited these people for their political ends but very little has been done to ensure a process of empowerment and social transformation.

Their basic rights need to be ensured by those who depend on them for their own survival as a matter of urgency.

**Nation:** The people of our nation are keeping the 75th anniversary of our independence this year amidst much shame and pain. The fact that we have been at the mercy of successive regimes that have been corrupt is evident. Besides the economic debacle that we are forced to contend with, the distinctly repressive efforts by the incumbent government to impose themselves on the people is a poor reflection of the quality of political leadership.

Those in political leadership appear more reluctant to have a system in place to hold those in positions of responsibility accountable for their misdeeds while in office.

The extravagant state expenditure being incurred for non-essentials and curbs on some of the essentials that a large number of our people depend on like medications and imposing of unreasonable taxes on the majority of the people is testament to this fact.

# STATEMENT BY THE NATIONAL CHRISTIAN COUNCIL OF SRI LANKA ON THE $75^{TH}$ ANNIVERSARY OF THE INDEPENDENCE OF OUR COUNTRY – SRI LANKA

As we prepare ourselves to celebrate the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Independence of our country and its people, The National Christian Council of Sri Lanka (NCCSL) with Thanksgiving to God, offers its greetings in solidarity with the hopes and aspirations of the people, drawing the attention of its leaders to the following.

We gratefully remember all our past leaders, who with life commitment, campaigned and contributed towards the realization of Independence of our beloved country – Sri Lanka. Hence, it is our desire and hope that our present leaders, from the political, religious and civil society too will work with the same courage, wisdom and foresight to uphold and sustain the hallowed principles of a United Sri Lanka.

Acknowledging the rich diversity and intrinsic values of our beloved nation in the fabric of its existence, it is of foremost importance that the fruits of genuine freedom and dignified unity is acutely expressed and adequately exhibited in the lives of its people. This calls for political stability with a new constitution promoting 'power sharing' guaranteeing the protection and rights of the identities of race, religion, class and culture so that all citizens may live and have their being as 'One People' of Mother Lanka.

The commemoration of the 75 years of Independence of our country, coincides with the commemoration of 200 years of existence of our brothers and sisters among us -The Malaiyaha Makkal; one of the first and major foreign exchange earners in our nation. In the ensuing economic crisis; the pangs of which are evident in almost every sector of activities of 'health, education, finances, employment, agriculture, livelihood etc.' and the unified effort to address and overcome the said calamity; we call upon the Government to lead by example by curtailing and putting an end to corruption, extravagant spending, expansion and appointment of ministers, which are highly unnecessary, unproductive and a huge burden on the people.

The National Christian Council of Sri Lanka (NCCSL) as a faith -oriented body, is mindful, alert and deeply conscious of the prevailing situation of the country in the on-going cries of- Whither Freedom? Hence, we strongly advocate for the cause of Justice, Truthfulness and Goodwill to be manifested and instituted, in order to celebrate and experience a meaningful Unity and Freedom of our Nation.

#### MALAYAGA MAKKAL

The 'Malayaga Makkal' will commemorate two hundred years of their existence in this country this year, 2023.

The tea plantations were one of the first foreign exchange earners for our country and laid the foundation for developments in the fields of education, health and infrastructure development that benefitted all communities in the country.

The Malayaga Makkal community, which over the years was referred to as the "Indian Tamil" or "Upcountry Tamil" community, for many years served as sacrificial labour, exploited and living in sub-human conditions despite being the backbone of the island's economy. We recall that this community cleared the treacherous jungles, courted danger and sacrificed their lives to firstly establish the plantations and thereafter worked under torrid conditions to make the plantations viable and ultimately a sector that was not only crucial to the country's economic development, but also an internationally recognized brand name for the country.

It is a matter of regret, however, that the vital contribution made by this community was not recognized and appreciated and that for decades the members of this community were subject to systemic discrimination. The Citizenship Acts deprived them of citizenship; they were denied other basic human rights related to their dignity, privacy, economic security and educational opportunities. Though they have historically worked on the land, their rights to access and own land is severely curtailed. There is a shortage of public officers who speak the Tamil language in divisional secretariats and other governmental offices that are meant to cater to the needs of the people in the areas in which they live.

The United Nations Special Rapporteur on Contemporary Forms of Slavery, Tomoya Obokata, who visited Sri Lanka in December 2021, in his report to the Human Rights Council in 2022 noted that

"The Malayaga Tamils- who were brought from India to work in the plantation sector 200 years ago-continue to face multiple forms of discrimination based on their origin."











On this historical occasion, the Church, as the Christ Community commits itself to journey together with this community towards its legitimate and deserved goals and objectives. As Sri Lanka celebrates the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of independence from colonial rule, the Church of Ceylon calls upon the Government and people to take steps to eliminate the multiple forms of discrimination faced by the Malayaga Makkal community so that they can become equal citizens of a truly multi-ethnic and multi-religious Sri Lanka.


